#### ***Budget 2011-12 & setting of precept***

Councillors are fully aware that everyone is going through times of financial stringency. The Parish Council has always spent frugally and kept low reserves. However, the low level of precept compared with neighbouring villages has made it difficult to provide improvements for parishioners. It was decided to set the precept for 2011-12 at £15,000, an increase of £4.89 per band D household. This is the money for operating costs given to Barton by South Cambs, raised as a very small part of your Council Tax.

#### ***Barton BeaVers & small works***

The Haggis Farm path nettles have been trimmed and some tree guards removed. The School Lane parking bays have now been created and the water chamber lowered. John Boocock was complimented and thanked for his work.

#### ***Disabled signs at the Village Hall***

Those with disabilities who wish to have a parking space reserved should contact event organisers to make use of the "parking for disabled" signs now available.

**Neighbourhood Watch**

There have been a few thefts in Barton recently, mainly of valuable items left in cars. Please be careful not to leave anything of value in your car as thieves can break in wherever the car is parked.

There have been reports of high-pressure selling of burglar alarms and other security equipment recently, and the police advise us to get at least 3 quotes, and look for companies that are accredited by NSI (National Security Inspectorate) or SSIAB (Security Systems & Alarm Inspection Board).

Barton is rated by the police as an average crime area at present. The detection rate is less than 30 percent, so we need to do what we can to prevent crime and keep our property safe.
